





A MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIRMAN OF WATER SAFETY IRELAND



I am delighted to present to you the WSI Calendar 2020, brought to you through the kind and generous support of a number of sponsors, to whom I extend our grateful appreciation.

As the Chairman of Water Safety Ireland (WSI), I take particular delight in greeting all the members of WSI. I wish to thank you and to acknowledge the tremendous voluntary work you undertake nationwide throughout the entire year. I especially wish to highlight the excellent work of our Winter and Summer Course Organisers. Last summer the weather was not kind to our instructors. However, this did not impact on the dedication and energy to which instructors applied themselves at training centres nationwide.

A particularly gratifying reflection of our growth is in the increase of our membership. Almost 5,000 of you are now contributing to our organisation nationwide and to each and every one of you, I extend my personal thanks.

Water Safety Ireland volunteers have been busy nationwide teaching swimming, lifesaving, basic life support, rescue skills and the promotion of water safety awareness to the public. Although the number of lives saved and aquatic accidents avoided as a result of our work can never be fully enumerated, we can certainly point to the 260 rescues by Lifeguards this summer as a reflection of their important work. These same Lifeguards, trained and assessed by Water Safety Ireland, administered first aid on 3,284 occasions, reunited with their loved ones a total of 289 lost children found wandering alone by the water's edge and gave advice on almost 90,000 occasions.

In terms of the Sport of Lifesaving, Water Safety Ireland's national teams had their best performances ever abroad, bringing home the highest number of medals from an International Lifesaving Championships than ever before. Every member of each team, be they juniors, seniors or masters, or coaches, played a pivotal role in achieving this success. We congratulate them and celebrate their accomplishments.

Our Primary Aquatics Water Safety (PAWS) programme is a key learning platform for parents and teachers to become aware of the importance of teaching water safety to children. Thanks to schoolteachers, volunteers and our Education Officer, water safety is brought to life in classrooms and homes throughout Ireland. Through continued government funding and sponsorship, we were able to deliver a national marketing and media campaign to highlight the dangers of our waters. Initiatives rolled out this year included the delivery of 600,000 branded wristbands to schools across the country, dedicated radio advertising and online promotions.

The Sports Commission had a very busy year; preparing, running and promoting thirteen regional and national competitions with over 2,000 competitors taking part. Our Inshore Rescue Boats Commission secured world recognition for the Rescue Driver and Crew Qualifications in 2019, placing both awards on the world equivalency table. For our Education Commission, there has been a focus on the realignment of Water Safety Ireland child protection policies, standards and procedures in line with the national guideline. The Swimming Commission initiated their Disability

Swimming Teacher's Tutors course and had 28 candidates complete the programme.

At this time of year in particular, our thoughts are with the families of those members who have passed away. I am also conscious of the number of members who have lost family members themselves. We extend our deepest sympathies to all families who are feeling their loss. Ar dheis Dé go raibh a n-anamacha.

Throughout the course of the year, our Council members have demonstrated constant commitment and dedication to Water Safety Ireland's programme of work. I wish to thank each of them for their efforts during 2019 and look forward to working with them again in 2020 and beyond.

The staff of Water Safety Ireland's head office provide essential support all year round; without them we could not deliver our objectives. I would like to thank them for their continued hard work and welcome the two new staff members who joined the team in 2019.

Finally, I wish you and your loved ones good health and happiness for the festive season. I hope you enjoy the fellowship of new friends, and cherish the company of family in this season of loving and sharing.

Together, let's bring drownings down.

the statutory, voluntary body and registered charity established to promote water safety and reduce drownings in Ireland.

Our focus is on Public Awareness and Education. Tragically, an average of 124 people drown in Ireland each year, eleven every month. We strive to reduce these fatalities by increasing water safety awareness and by changing attitudes and behaviours so that our aquatic environments can be enjoyed with confidence and safety.

WHAT WE DO:

1. Education:

- a) An education syllabus that teaches swimming, lifesaving, water confidence, safety, survival, rescue skills and basic life support;
- b) Courses are provided nationwide to the general public and also to children as part of the primary school curriculum in classrooms, pools and open water nationwide;

- c) Many qualifications such as our Pool and Beach Lifeguarding Awards are recognised internationally;
- d) Beach Lifeguards are trained and tested by our examiners for the Local Authorities prior to the annual summer season each year;
- e) Trained Lifesavers compete in provincial and national Lifesaving Championships and at International level;
- f) Risk Assessments on bathing areas and waterways nationwide that may pose a particular risk to the public, in order to make them safer;
- g) Train and examine rescue boat crews for the Community Inshore Rescue Services and administer associated VAT refunds.
- h) Water safety training for those working near aquatic environments, in the public and private sector.

2. Promotion:

- a) Research, analysis and publication of drowning statistics that inform policy and enable effective targetting of those at risk of drowning;
- b) National and local media to build a public awareness of coastal and inland water safety;
- c) Publications, courses, advice and campaigns in print and online that promote water safety and target at-risk groups in all aquatic activities so that the public adheres to best practices;
- d) Supporting the work of over 4,900 volunteer members and those volunteering and commercially delivering swimming, lifesaving and basic life support training;
- e) A National Water Safety Awards Ceremony that includes the "Seiko Just-In-Time" Rescue Award

and other awards that recognise volunteerism and partnerships that promote water safety at national and local level.

3. Partnerships:

- a) Local Authorities, state agencies, private enterprises and coroners on matters relating to water safety, the provision of Public Rescue Equipment and Lifeguarding locations nationwide;
- b) The Marine Safety Working Group and the Irish Marine Search and Rescue Committee to promote maritime safety;
- c) A range of organisations to help reduce the high number of drownings by suicide;
- d) Conferences, lectures and demonstrations to Local Authorities, Government Agencies, NGOs, schools, Colleges and members of the public.
